GOSPEL WORKERS TRANSFERRED

The India Evangelical Lutheran Church has adopted a policy that she may transfer her pastors to a new location every five years. Almost all of the Christian denominations in India follow this practice.

As a result the Board for Missions of the IELC has made the following transfers in the Malabar Mission Circle:

⇒ Pr. R. J. Richard and his family moved from Vadattupara to Mundakutty to serve Immanuel Lutheran Church, the largest congregation in the MMC. Mundakutty was vacated because Mr. S. S. Shermar was sponsored by the Rev. Dr. J. Samuel, the president of the IELC, to study for a Bachelor of Divinity degree at Gurukul Lutheran Theological College in Chennai, Tamil Nadu.

⇒ Pr. J. Devaraj transferred from Chooralmala to St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Vadattupara. No one has yet been assigned to Chooralmala.

⇒ The Rev. A. T. Baby has been transferred from St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Sulthan Bathery, and Immanuel Lutheran Church, Moolankavu, to a congregation in the Trivandrum area.

Other changes in personnel have been made among the evangelists. Mr. Shine S. L. Raj became sick with hepatitis in April, 2009, and he is still recuperating. Please pray for his complete recovery. Mr. Jijo was assigned to take his place at the Open Door (Men's) Reading Room in Kannur. Miss Soosen George is orientating and supervising him.

Miss Smitha Babu has left *Vanitha* Women's Reading Room in Kannur because of a job offer in the Thiruvananthapuram area and arrangements for her marriage. In her place Miss Lizy is now working with Soosen George at *Vanitha*. Miss Lizy is 23 years old and has passed the SSLC Examination (10th Standard) and a two years course in Maintenance and Repair of Domestic Appliances in 2006. We welcome Lizy to the Gospel Workers' team in the MMC.

Mr. John Tennison is assigned as temporary evangelist at the Friendship Library and Reading Room in Malapuram. He reports that 60-75 people are visiting daily and that many people have become close friends with him. Three men are showing a real interest to study about Jesus and to attend classes on Jesus and the Bible. Mr. John was trained as an evangelist as a young man and recently retired from the staff at the Christian Welfare Centre in Malapuram.

The Rev. P. G. Henry has retired, but he continues to serve Christ Lutheran Church, Kalpetta, and in Meenangadi. He and his wife are living in the renovated and repaired parsonage in Kalpetta.

The transfers leave Chooralmala and Sulthan Bathery without workers. In the past Tiruvali, Peragamanna, and Kazhinjiriyil have been served by an evangelist, but the Rev. S. S. Oliver has been serving them from Wandoor with lay assistance.

May God richly bless these workers and their families in these Gospel ministries at these new sites and in these new situations. May the Holy Spirit give them strength to adjust and wisdom to meet the challenges and needs of the people in these communities in creative and sensitive ways. ❖

VBS REACHES INTO COMMUNITIES

The congregations in the Malabar Mission Circle emphasize Vacation Bible School, because it is an effective way to reach into homes and communities with the Gospel of Jesus the Christ, Who loves children.

Summer in India is during April and May. In 2009 in the Malabar Mission Circle twenty six Vacation Bible Schools were held, and a total of 1,326 students attended. Of them 735 were Hindu, 228 were Muslim, and 362 were Christian. Thirty five teachers were involved.

The largest VBS attendance was 308 students in Chooralmala (Puthumala), where Pr. J. Devaraj is the evangelist. They conducted three sessions. The congregation is made up of tea pickers and their families, who are provided housing by the tea estate owners.

Thiruvalli and Wandoor, under the leadership of the Rev. S. S. Oliver and Mr. C. D. Solomon, held a total of eight VB Schools, and their total number of students reached 300, a close second to Chooralmala. Mr. Solomon is also the Accounting Business Manager of Karunalaya Hospital in Wandoor.

A new site for a VBS this year was in Mamivayal, where The

with 95 students).

It is impressive that these congregations conduct so many VBS sessions. Many of our congregations in Canada and the USA have difficulty conducting one VBS per year. May God bless the sowing of the seed of His Word that it may fall on good soil by the working of the Holy Spirit and bring a bountiful harvest. ❖

Rev. Dr. K. M. Victor worked with five teachers, and 51 students attended: 21 Hindu, 4 Muslim, and 26 Christian.

The third largest number of students was in the Naduvil field where Ms. Soosen George conducted four VB Schools with four teachers. Of the 245 attendees, 174 were Hindu, 42 Muslim, and 29 Christian.

The three VB Schools held in Sulthan Bathery by the Rev. A. T. Baby had a total enrollment of 220 (145 Hindu, 4 Muslim, 71 Christian).

Other VB Schools were held in Vadattupara by Pr. R. J. Richard (three sessions with 49 students); in Malapuram and Chelloor by the Rev. I. Titus with 31 and 27 students respectively; and in Kozhikode/Calicut by the Rev. T. Joseph (three sessions

Youth Seminar Held in Manjeri

On September 11-12, 2009, fifty one young people gathered for a youth seminar in Manjeri on the compound where the Rev. K. K. Alavi centers his ministry. The Rev. T. Joy led discussions on Christian Stewardship, and the Rev. Dr. K. M. Victor presented biblical materials on how to make decisions.

It was good to connect this seminar with Rev. Alavi's ministry. The facilities, supported by funds from the New Hope Mission at Faith Lutheran Church, Hutchison, MN, are especially designed for these kinds of events. The next Christian Life Convention in the MMC is scheduled to be held at this site as well.

We pray God's special blessing upon the young people who attended this seminar that they grow in their faith and develop their skills as witnesses who make disciples of Jesus among their friends. ❖

Gospel Workers Attend Meeting

Fourteen of the Gospel Workers of the Malabar Mission Circle met on 22 July, 2009, in Kozhikode. At the opening Service of Holy Communion the Rev. T. Joy preached on John 6:32-40, Jesus' words regarding testimonies about Him. The Rev. Dr. K. M. Victor presented a Bible study on "The Mission Methods of St. Paul."

The workers reported a total of nine non-Christian families and individuals who are attending church services and/or attending Baptism classes. Rev. Oliver reported that a lady was baptized in Wandoor. Pray that the Holy Spirit of Jesus will create and sustain saving faith in the hearts of these new believers.

The workers noted that the Malayalam hymnal recently printed as a project of the Malabar Mission Society is now out of stock. The workers expressed their thanks to the MMS for the financial support for printing the first revised edition. Since there is still a demand for the book, and there is enough money from the sale proceeds to print 1,000 copies, the workers requested the MMS to print a second edition. Since the sales proceeds of the hymnal were intended for additional printing as needed, the MMS is proceeding to print a second edition. Music is such an important factor in the worship life of the Lutheran Christians in India. The literacy rate in Kerala is high, so new Christians are usually able to read the Word of God in hymn form as well as in the Bible. Eventually, most of the Christians memorize their favorite hymns, and the children and grandchildren learn the songs from hearing them often during home devotions. May God continue to bless this project, so that worshipers in Malabar have resources to praise and glorify God.

The Rev. T. Joseph, the coordinator for the Bible Correspondence Course program in MMC, requested that the

Malayalam booklet "Who is This Man?" be printed again so that it could be included in the course mailings. It was originally printed and circulated by the late Rev. H. J. Otten, the missionary in Wandoor. Other workers supported this idea of printing the pamphlet because it is a very good tract for Gospel work, especially among Muslims. The Rev. Joy, Rev. Dr. Victor, and the Project Officer are working on funding for this project either from the current budget or from special funds. The cost to print 15,000 copies is estimated at Rs 26,000 or Canadian \$650.00. ❖
